Director's Corner



Each day at SafeSpot, I watch as children and families walk into our center for the first time with fear and worry written on their faces. Children are referred to SafeSpot by Fairfax police and social service workers regarding child abuse concerns. When child abuse is first discovered, many people are very busy working to help stop the abuse but may not think about what justice means to the child and family.

Recently, child abuse cases in the national news shed a bright light on what children go through when abuse is discovered. Some may find justice in the courtroom, others may find justice in therapy and some may never find justice. When children are not provided a safe place to navigate healing from child abuse, justice may be hard to find.

SafeSpot provided a safe place for over 400 forensic interviews of abused children in 2017. We assisted in 14% more cases than in 2016. Hundreds of worried parents were able to talk with our Family Advocate and get the support needed to ensure information about the criminal justice process was communicated in a trauma-informed manner.

SafeSpot provides no-cost mental health services to children who are victims of abuse. In 2017, 84% of children that graduated from therapy reported a decrease in trauma symptoms. Each year, more children graduate from the therapy program at SafeSpot. Children experience significantly fewer intrusive thoughts and avoidance behaviors as well as show reductions in depression, anxiety, disassociation, behavior problems, sexualized behavior, and trauma-related shame. We are sharing a message of hope and healing with children that will last a lifetime.

Justice comes in many forms. It is our job to keep working so that children and families who walk in our building find their justice.
